
The Incredible Bedrooms of an Irish Castle



Seguoia

Our sprawling 567-acre estate of lush private parkland features over 300 species of trees and plants, hand-picked centuries ago by The Baron Irnham. However, situated down in the Glen, one tree towers over all of them. In 2004, our magnificent Giant Sequoia (Wellingtonia) was measured by laser and found to be, at over 50 metres, the second tallest of its kind in Ireland. Named in its honour, this snug en-suite bedroom is in a quiet corner of the castle. Designed to maximize the peace and quiet, it features a luxurious king-sized bedroom draped in 100% cotton bed linen. Bathed in soothing light and calming tones, it's a place designed to maximize the peaceful nature of the landscape that surrounds it.

Major Hamilton

Before being sold to the world-famous Guinness family in 1927, Luttrellstown Castle was purchased by an army major in 1915. Although he only occupied it for three short years before his untimely death, he and his wife looked after it with a great passion. To honour his memory and their dedication to the castle, we have passionately restored this magnificent castle bedroom. Situated on the lower ground level, next to our beautifully landscaped courtyard, this peaceful room features a large king-sized bed surrounded by luxurious furnishings and fabrics. In the spacious en-suite bathroom, you can also enjoy a large walk-in shower filled with Molton Brown bathroom beauty accessories.

Liffey

While our majestic castle has been a proud resident of Dublin since the 15th century, The River Liffey has been around since before Dublin even existed. We are privileged to have one of the world's most iconic landmarks running right through our estate, culminating in a 20-acre lake down in the Glen. As a celebration of Dublin's most famous resident, this cosy and quiet courtyard room is awash with luxury throughout. Lying amongst the elegant furniture with soothing tones, your king-sized bed is covered in 100% cotton bed linen. Next to it lies a high, ornate window that looks out over some of the 567-acres of woodlands that surround the estate. In your spacious en- suite bathroom you can enjoy dual sinks, a walk-in shower, and a range of luxurious Molten Brown bathroom beauty accessories.

Woodlands

The wealthy bookseller Luke White renamed Luttrellstown Castle to 'Woodlands' when he purchased it in 1829. Shortly thereafter, Luttrellstown Castle was returned to its former legacy although what is far less easy to forget is the feeling that comes from staying in the charming Woodlands bedroom. The moment you enter through its tall historic door, you'll notice the majestic king-sized bed, with its thick mattress covered in luxurious 100% cotton monogrammed bed linen. Next to it lies a large, high, and ornate window that looks out over some of the 567-acres of woodlands that surround the estate. This memorable courtyard room also features a spacious en-suite bathroom with walk-in shower filled with luxurious Molton Brown bathroom beauty accessories.

Gunroom

Unique even by Luttrellstown Castle's exceptional standards, this one-of-a-kind bedroom is set inside one of the original 15th-century towers. For centuries, it was the home for residents' hunting guns and equipment. Today, this lovingly reinstated room contains several features that haven't changed since then. The only thing more distinctive than the curved walls of the room, is the windows set within them. Some of the oldest and most elegantly ornate windows in the entire property, they beam light in from the courtyard just outside them. Bathed in natural light and covered in soothing tones, this iconic room features a double bed draped in luxurious 100% cotton linen. While just off it, is a spacious en-suite bathroom with walk- in shower and Molton Brown bathroom beauty accessories.

Prince Pückler

In 1831, the famous writer Prince Pückler Muskan visited Luttrellstown Castle. He was so taken by the beauty of the surrounding landscape that he wrote about the Glen and its 'Gay shrubs and wildflowers, the softest turf and giant trees, festooned with creeping plants, fill the narrow glen through which the path winds.' This beautiful bedroom takes inspiration from his memorable words, mixing the softest hues of the fabrics and furnishings with the natural light that comes in through the ornate windows. At the centre of this cosy space lies a magnificent king-size bed draped in luxurious 100% cotton linen. Above it hangs a glorious chandelier that provides an added touch of elegance to the effortlessly stylish surroundings. There's also a fold-out sofa bed for additional guests. The en-suite includes a walk-in shower filled with luxurious Molton Brown bathroom beauty accessories.

Guinness Suite

The signature suite of Luttrellstown Castle is a fitting tribute to one of Ireland's most famous families and one its former owners. This lavish, ground-floor suite includes a separate, spacious living room that lets you sit back and relax in the lap of luxury, as you spend your evening stretched out in front of the incredible views outside your window. Then, when it's time to lay back and get some well-deserved sleep, enjoy sinking into your immense king bed. This really is 15th century living, with 21st century luxury.

Lady Granville Suite

When Aileen Plunket married, her father, the patriarch of the world-famous Guinness family, gifted her Luttrellstown Castle as a wedding present. When her own daughter Doon married a second cousin to Queen Elizabeth the II, she became Lady Granville. The stunning suite named in her honour, is bathed in natural light through the three ornate windows, comprising of two separate bedrooms. Feel at home in a spacious bedroom boasting a magnificent king bed as well as a roomy living area with a fold-out sofa bed facing the original, elegant fireplace and an adjacent room boasting a plush double bed draped in 100% cotton linen. The spacious shared en-suite features a walk-in shower filled with Molton Brown bathroom beauty accessories.

Aileen Plunkett

When your father is a member of the world-famous Guinness family, it's probably not that surprising to be given an incredible gift like your very own Irish castle. When you are a guest in the original room of Aileen Plunket (née Guinness), you shouldn't be surprised if you fall head over heels in love with what's on offer. From the luxurious four-poster bed and beautiful bay windows to the stunning stand-alone tub situated right in the middle of the adjoining bathroom, this truly is a taste of the life of luxury experienced by this exceptional woman.

Carhampton

Just like the man it's named after; this is one of the most interesting bedrooms in the entire castle. With a unique style lifted straight out of the time of Simon Luttrell, this is a spacious, beautifully restored bedroom that is full of all the character and charm rightly associated with a historic, 15th century Irish castle. The room is thoughtfully furnished with beautiful pieces befitting the period and lovingly decorated with soft pastel colours that provide a bright airy feel. This wonderful space is perfectly completed with the vintage chaise lounge that looks out the large window, across the sprawling lands once loved by the 2nd Earl of Carhampton.

Baron Irnham

When you are the man responsible with planting most of what grows on a sprawling 567-acre parkland estate, it is only right that the room named after you centuries later, boasts panoramic views looking out over your incredible creation. The Baron Irnham is centrally located in the castle, so that it's close enough to all its amenities. This big, bright room is centred around a king bed that sits under a magnificent bedhead. But the pièce de résistance in this space of timeless luxury must surely be the stunning bay window that offers its lucky occupants unrivalled views out over the Baron's spectacular estate.

King John

It's hard to know where to look first when you step across the threshold of one of the standout bedrooms in the entire castle. Then there's the quaint dressing table and the big comfortable pull-out sofa beds. Or maybe the massive double/twin bed, delicately covered with embroidered pillows and luxurious bedding, will catch your eye. More than any of these, however, there's nothing quite like the view out of the two big bay windows, with their unrivalled views of the castle's famous gardens. When you've taken everything in, take some time to see if you can find the King's private stairway – now sealed - down to the Van Stry ballroom and see why his quarters were so special.

Lord Annaly

Named after one of the most recent owners of this magnificent castle, The Lord Annaly is a beautiful balance of old-world charm, with carefully considered modern finishes. This is a spacious, bright en-suite castle bedroom, lovingly decorated with an incredible wrought iron double bed and warm, vibrant colours. This was the favourite room of a man who once had Afternoon Tea with Queen Victoria down in the glen that can still be seen through its big bay windows.

Millennium

On one of the walls in this wonderful Irish castle, is a large painting of Aileen Plunkett's famous racehorse Millennium, who spent the 1930s galloping across the sprawling Luttrellstown estate. As well as being buried on the estate he once roamed, this magnificent horse is also honoured with one of the most eye-catching rooms in the entire castle. High ceilings, an ornate wardrobe, vintage furniture and a beautifully big bay window surround a stunning four-poster bed that forms the centrepiece of this large, luxurious bedroom. While The Millennium at Luttrellstown Castle Resort in Dublin is named after a racehorse, it's fit for royalty.

Luke White

Wealthy and well-connected Dublin bookseller Luke White became the first person outside the Luttrell family to own the Irish castle when he bought it from them around 1829. While his renaming of the castle to 'Woodlands' never stuck, his memory remains in this beautifully decorated bedroom. The elegant, elevated en-suite marble-finished bathroom is just one of the unique features of this soothing and spacious bedroom. There are also a host of sophisticated furnishings like the vintage dressing table, the wonderful wardrobe and the enormous fireplace. Finally, the big bay window that offers unrivalled views of the sprawling estate, makes the perfect place to sit back and relax as you honour his memory by losing yourself in a good book.

Queen Victoria

On two of her visits to Dublin, this beautiful room was the preferred choice of the famous monarch. Like many of our guests since, the famous Queen adored this room for its simple sophistication, homely layout and effortlessly-comfortable finish. However, it is the secluded location at the south side of the castle, overlooking the picturesque front gardens, that really sets it apart from the rest of the rooms on offer at Luttrellstown Castle Resort. With a quaint en-suite bathroom just a few steps from the large double bed, this private, tranquil paradise has everything a Queen could want.

Duchess of Cumberland

They say the first thing everyone noticed about Anne, the Duchess of Cumberland, was her enchanting eyes. The first thing you'll notice in this classic Irish castle bedroom, is the beautiful four-poster double bed with its huge mattress and ornate curtains. As you pass your eyes across the enchanting bedroom named in her honour, take in the carefully chosen furniture that perfectly balances charm with comfort. However, the best part of this bedroom must be waking up to the incredible views of the courtyard and surrounding gardens, provided by the large bay windows.

Luttrell

At the very heart of this magical Irish castle, above its magnificent, looping arched entranceway, lies a master bedroom named in honour of its original inhabitants. What awaits you through the ornate Gothic hallway and up the glorious grand staircase, is a striking four-poster double bed beneath an endlessly high ceiling. To the side, is a big bay window with panoramic views out over the castle's sprawling estate. Fully refurbished with some of the most beautiful pieces from that time period, this lovely room is rightly known as the heart of Luttrellstown Castle.

Lady Elizabeth

Like her sister the Duchess of Cumberland, Lady Elizabeth, the second daughter of former owner Simon Luttrell, has a unique castle bedroom worthy of her name. This stunning, spacious, and effortlessly luxurious twin family room contains two double beds allowing you to sleep up to four people. To the side, there's a beautiful and fully equipped en-suite bathroom complete with a walk-in shower. With snug furniture sitting under the lovely wide windows that look out over the inner courtyard of the castle, you and your family or friends have enough space to experience a little bit of luxury, just like the Luttrells.

Sir Geoffrey

The Luttrellstown estate only exists because Sir Geoffrey Luttrell purchased the land while accompanying King John to Ireland in 1210. To recognise the debt we owe to him, we reinstated one of the largest and most beautiful bedrooms in the magnificent castle that now stands on his demesne. This stunning first floor suite is made up of three separate rooms. In the large bedroom, there's a king-sized bed draped in luxurious 100% cotton linen. In the ensuite, there are dual sinks, a spacious walk-in shower and luxurious Molton Brown bathroom beauty accessories. Bathed in natural light and surrounded by warm tones and rich hues, the effortlessly comfortable sitting room includes large original windows, a grand bookcase, a magnificent fireplace, a fold-out sofa, and multiple palaces to sit back and enjoy the whole experience.
